LESSON PLAN

	SECOND TEACHERS' SELF-DEVELOPMENT LESSON		
PROJECT "BOOST YOUR ENGLISH"			
TOPIC	Let's get to knowbefore travelling together!		
AIMS	 get to know each other; learn how to make questions and use them in context to interact with the peers; improve teachers' communicative skills and provide confidence with the phrases/sentences connected to travelling; share learning strategies and learning tips (A. S. I. – Qu. A. S. I. attached 0). 		
TIME	1 LESSON (60 minutes)		
MATERIALS	 Worksheet with official questions (attached 2) Worksheet with a table to fill in with names of the participants and extra information (attached 3) Worksheet with pictures linked to travelling (attached 4) Worksheet with pictures linked to travelling and official answers (attached 5) Pictures linked to travelling shown on the board (attached 6) Teachers' attendance sheet (attached 7) Interactive Whiteboard 		
PROCEDURE	Presentation of the objectives: speaking activity for personal training and sharing learning strategies and tips.		
STEP 1	BRAINSTORMING: The presenter draws a big question mark ? on the board and asks participants to brainstorm interrogative pronouns.		
	Then she asks what kind of questions they know: yes no question /open ended questions and gives them the hint: (attached 0) A. S. I. (auxiliary – subject – infinitive) Qu. A. S. I. (Question word - subject – infinitive)		
STEP 2	Activity: FIND OUT THE ORIGINAL QUESTIONS. The Speaker hands out worksheet with personal answers (attached 1). The participants, in pairs/in groups of 3, find the correct QUESTIONS and write them. The presenter, at the end of the activity, hands out the photocopy with official questions (attached 2)		
STEP 3	Activity: FIND SOMEONE WHO The speaker gives students a worksheet with a table to fill in with names of the participants and extra information (attached 3).		
	Participants have to stand up and ask questions to their peers. The aim is to have as many different names as possible.		

	Example: 'find someone who travels for business'. They should ask 'Do you travel for work?' I the person answers YES', they 'write his/her name. In the column 'extra information' they car add: he travels to South Africa/England/the USA				
	After that, they change person and so on The first one to finish, WINS a prize (a box of chocolates!)				
	Participants are invited to USE the questions of the previous activity.				
STEP 4	The speaker shows some pictures linked to travelling on the board (attached 6) and asks the participants to BRAINSTORM words connected to the images. Then she hands out the photocopy with the same pictures (attached 4) and invites them, in small groups, to write a <i>list of words</i> connected to travelling, next to each pictures (at least 2 or 3 words).				
	On the board, she summarizes all their ideas, eliciting or suggesting other new words and writing them so that they can copy on their sheet.				
STEP 5	Exceptionally, just in order to spare time, the speaker hands out a photocopy with the official/possible answers (attached 5). She usually suggests students to TAKE NOTES during an ordinary English/CLIL lesson.				
STEP 6	TO SUM UP:				
	STARTING NEW ACTIVITIES WITH BRAINSTORMING ACTIVATES PREVIOUS KNOWLEDGE AND ALREADY KNOWN VOCABULARY; IT IS HELPFUL TO EXPAND VOCABULARY.				
	> USE VISUAL AIDS: THEY HELP RECOLLECT IDEAS AND ARE USEFUL TO REMEMBER.				
	FIRST ELICIT VOCABULARY THEN GIVE NEW WORDS.				
	➢ GIVE MODELS TO SCAFFOLD STUDENTS' PRODUCTION.				
	> INVITE STUDENTS TO TAKE NOTES: IT WILL HELP THEM REMEMBER AND MEMORIZE.				
	PROVIDE LEARNING TIPS: THEY HELP STUDENTS UNDERSTAND AND PUT INTO PRACTICE MORE EASILY WHAT THEY HAVE LEARNT.				
	➤ USE WARM UP ACTIVITIES TO START THE LESSON: THEY GET TO KNOW EACH OTHER, MAKE STUDENTS FEEL MORE CONFIDENT AND COMFORTABLE.				
	> START FROM ANSWERS IS A STRATEGY TO IMPROVE QUESTIONING.				
	▶ PEER TO PEER ACTIVITIES ALLOW STUDENTS TO PRACTISE WITHOUT FEELING ANY PRESSURE OR JUDGEMENT BY THE TEACHER; THEY FEEL FREEDOM OF CHOICE AND MOVEMENT. LIMIT: NO ACCURACY IS REQUIRED. BUT THE TEACHER, OBSERVING AND LISTENING, AT THE END CAN PROVIDE CORRECT MODELS.				
	➤ USE GAMES DURING THE LESSON: THEY MOTIVATE STUDENTS AND STIMULATE THE LEARNING PROCESS. NEVER FORGET THE PRIZE!
