1. What is your daily routine in Dublin?

I'll get up at 6:30.

First I'll brush my teeth and comb my hair.

After that, I'll get dressed and I'll have breakfast with my colleagues.

At 7:45 I'll go to school on foot or by public transport, and from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. I'll have my lessons.

Then I'll have lunch.

In the afternoon I'll visit the city with my colleagues.

At 6:30 p.m. we'll go to the restaurant to have dinner and when I come back home I'll have a shower and go to bed at 10 p.m.

2. Who invented the Erasmus project?

This question leads me first to explain you what the name ERASMUS means.

ERASMUS = EuRopean community Action Scheme for the Mobility of University Students. The name comes from Erasmo from Rotterdam who, at the beginning of the 16th century, travelled all over Europe to understand the different cultures of this big and complex land.

In 1969 the pedagogue and scientific consultant Sofia Corradi (named Mamma Erasmus) had the idea to promote cultural exchanges among European students.

But it was later, in 1987, that Frank Biancheri, a French politician, in collaboration with the President of France François Mitterand, appoved the birth of Erasmus.

A few years later, Erasmus was opened to high school students and teachers as well.





3. Do you need your passport to go there?

To go to Dublin a normal and valid identity card is enough, because Ireland belongs to the European Community.

4. Is this your first time in Dublin?

Yes, this is my first time in Ireland.

5. What do you do in your free time?
